MY (AND MARE'S) MUSTANG STORY

Back in April 1986, I was looking for an old car to drive and fix up. My friend, Mark A., had a 1965 Mustang convertible for sale that he had just repainted white. I liked the car and bought it. I had no idea what I'd bought. That was the beginning of "Ken's '65" as it would become affectionately known.

Within a year it needed the engine rebuilt. Mark did all the work for free but I paid for the parts. Also that year, I had the transmission rebuilt. After driving the Mustang for a few years, I decided to restore it in 1989. Little did I know what was in store for me.

It needed inner rockers, floor pans, torque boxes, partial outer wheel wells and rear quarters. I did all the dirty work and a friend, Joe T. did all the welding. During the restoration, I discovered that the car was originally Vintage Burgundy. The decision was made to go back to the original color with 12 coats of Vintage Burgundy lacquer and 4 coats of clear coat and Ken's '65 was back on the road.

The 90's were great, I learned a lot about early Mustangs from club members. Drove many, many miles to MCA and AACA shows all over the east coast. I, along with my wife Maryann (Mare) always drove the car. The car won many Silver and Gold awards in MCA. In AACA it won 1st Junior, Senior. 1st Place Grand National, Senior Grand National and repeat Senior Grand National, plus many other awards.

In 1990 the Ken's '65 went under water from Hurricane Floyd. I had the car completely stripped to bare metal and had a friend, Mustang Jim, do a complete restoration on the car. Any part that was bad was replaced with Ford sheet metal. I removed



all the undercoating on it. It was finished like a new car. This took about 2 years, but was well worth the wait.

We stopped doing National shows around 2005, using the car for fun and local cruises, etc. Many thanks to all our friends for helping make Ken's 65 the way it is today.

Going back to the year 2000, I had been working with Mustangs as a hobby; buying, fixing up and selling. Around the beginning of that year, Mare said she would like to have her own Mustang convertible and it would make a nice 25th wedding anniversary gift, hmmm. I started to look around and could not find anything.

The day of our anniversary, July 19th, I was home, as Mare and I had spent the day together, when the phone rang. It was my friend Mark A., whom I had bought Ken's '65 from back in 1986. He was in a bind and wanted to know if I wanted to buy his 1966 Mustang convertible. After looking at it, I thought the price was too high. Mark then made me an offer I couldn't refuse so I bought it.



THE GREAT GSRMC SPRING 2021 ROAD RALLYE

March 27th was a beautiful, sunny, mid-sixties spring day. It was the perfect setting for the Great GSRMC Spring 2021 Road Rallye. It was the perfect day to take your Mustang out and drive it for several hours over unfamiliar roads dictated by a piece of paper while answering questions of varying degrees of difficulty.

In the early days of the GSRMC, we used to run at least one rallye every year. The late, great Pete Lundell & his wife Donna were the rallyemasters more often than not. Bill Chernack and I had signed on to run the club's March cruise and we were trying to figure out where we wanted to go. I was doing some spring cleaning and happened across a few of the old rallye route directions. One of them was a rallye my wife Louise and I had set up in the nineties.



With the mindset of “what could’ve changed in 30 + years”, we set out to relive the rallye. Five or so hours and untold arguments later, we made it to the end point and realized two things; first, a lot can change in 30 + years and second, we wanted others to go



through the misery that we just experienced. Once we started talking to each other again, we made the necessary changes and had the Chernacks test it to see if it needed to be tweaked. As it turned out, Bill & Joanne never even got to the end point. Adjustments were

made and after several more trial runs we were ready to unleash it on the rallye newbies of the GSRMC.

We had 16 cars start the rallye, 14 Mustangs, a Firebird and an F-150. It was also nice to see members who turned out to see the rallyers off and meet them at the end. Some cars went right, some went left and they all travelled along lesser used roads in Bergen, Passaic and Rockland county, NY. They passed numerous historic sites, extravagant homes, quaint downtowns and even a miniature covered bridge. They answered questions about when towns were founded, the names of parks and whether the Red Mill is in fact red.

They stopped at historic Ringwood Manor where there is a cannon, a buried time capsule and
