### **A LOT ON HIS PLATES**

y name is Joe Pugliese, and I'm a 24 y/o graphic designer and license plate collector from Totowa, NJ and this is my Mustang story.

My Mustang journey began in early 2021. I had been driving a very reliable 2011 Jeep Grand Cherokee for the past 4 years, but my 18 y/o twin

brother and sister needed a car. The plan was always for me to give them the Jeep and get something fun and/or unusual for myself. I was always into cars; my childhood primarily consisted of having fun with Matchbox, Hot Wheels, and Johnny Lightning's. The best way I can I describe myself is Doug DeMuro-esque... I love the weird stuff and learning about quirks and features. Regardless, the first thing I wanted to look at was a Buick Regal TourX. I'm one of those weirdos who wants to preserve wagons by owning one, and the TourX was something within my budget so long as I could find one. I ultimately did, and I hated it. GM "plastic fantastic" strikes again. It was just a car, and not a comfortable one at that. I'm 6'7" and wider than a Humvee, so cars are difficult for me. While I am down about 70lbs since this past January, my height still limits what I can and cannot drive. From the Regal, I went on to a Volvo V60, which I loved but couldn't afford, then to various other cars that fit my criteria: Cadillac ATS coupe, Kia K900, Lincoln Continental, Mini Cooper JCW (I STILL want to own one

Then I went out to a VW dealer in Newton, NJ. I test drove a 2015 Mustang EcoBoost Premium and I fell in love instantly. The interior, the driving sensation, the features... it was the absolute perfect car and it blew everything else I test drove out of the water. Now I knew what I wanted, so I rounded up every Mustang in the tri-state and

of them!)... the list goes on.



went down the list. I test drove about 6 of them until I found mine. It was genuinely love at first drive. She was the smoothest, sleekest, most well-rounded one I drove. I was out testing it for so long that the salesman actually called me to see if I was alright LOL

According to the Carfax, it started out life as a rental car for 7 months, then it ultimately fell into the hands of a Chinese college student who attended Penn State (which I found out after getting service records from the listed dealerships). She only had 29k miles on the odo, and she was priced at an unbelievably low \$19,700. I still cannot fathom why it was priced so low given the chip shortage and everything, but the car was in dealer inventory for over 5 months by the time I found it in April 2021. The dealership itself is a whole other story.

She was in possession of Bridgewater Acura, who I am NEVER buying a car from again. Every person I dealt with treated me like a peasant the entire time, as if I were only looking to joyride it. I didn't even want to give them my business, but I could not let this particular car go to

someone else. I made sure to screw them out of every penny possible: I put the max amount possible on my credit card (purposely on my Amex so the fees would be higher on their end), then gave them the rest up front via a certified check. I bought it outright; no car payments, no interest payments to them, no nothing. She was all mine,

### 2024 FORD MUSTANG DARK HORSE IS START OF NEW MOTORSPORTS PUSH

fter literal years of waiting, the all-new, next-generation S650 2024 Ford Mustang was finally revealed last night, presenting us with a lot of familiar features and styling cues, but also some thoroughly modern tech and welcome changes. However, one thing that caught most by surprise was the fact that a brand

new variant was also unveiled – the 2024 Ford Mustang Dark Horse, a model that offers a slew of performance upgrades compared to the regular GT. However, the 2024 Ford Mustang Dark Horse isn't just the most powerful naturally-aspirated Ford 5.0L V8 Coyote powered pony car to date – it's also the start of a new motorsports push, too.

In addition to the road-going version of the Dark Horse, Ford will also offer two track-only versions of that particular variant – the Dark Horse S and the Dark Horse

R, both of which are powered by the Coyote The "S" V8. designed to appeal to weekend track day enthusiasts, a strippeddown vehicle with all non-essential trim and features removed, while Ford has also added all the requisite equipment safety

including a full FIA-certified safety cage, safety nets, a race seat with safety belts, a race steering wheel with quick disconnect, electrical disconnects. and a fire suppression system.

On the outside, the Mustang Dark Horse S features hood pins, front and rear tow hooks, an adjustable rear wing for added downforce and a full exhaust system, the same wheels as the street-legal Dark Horse, upgraded brakes, and Multimatic DSSV dampers. Inside the cabin, drivers will find center panel-mounted controls,



a pit speed limiter, data and acquisition display system, and an optional passenger seat.

The Dark Horse R takes things to the next level and is designed for hardcore racers, building upon the S with some additional features. Those include a special serialization that approves the car for racing, strategic seam welding, a fuel cell for increased range, and Ford Performance Parts wheels.

As if all of this isn't enough, the 2024 Ford Mustang Dark Horse will also spawn a new array of GT3,

GT4, NASCAR, and NHRA Factory X racing versions. The all-new Mustang GT3 IMSA race car marks the automaker's return to that series and will be available for customers to purchase. Set to debut at the 2024 24 Hours of Daytona and co-developed by

24 Hours of Daytona and co-developed by Ford and Multimatic, the Mustang GT3 is powered by a 5.4L Coyote-based V8 engine.

Meanwhile, the new Mustang GT4 racer – also available for customers to purchase – will debut in the 2023 season and will be available for global GT4 classes in IMSA, SRO, and FIA GT. The new Mustang dedicated to the Australian Supercars series will launch next year, and in the longer-term future, new Mustang NASCAR Cup series and NHRA Factory X racing variants will emerge, too.

He drew the original drawing/sketch that eventually became the car that we all know and love. The museum is now run and maintained by his daughter Karen. While you may think it was just a simple trip to view another car museum, we had a surprise in store for Mr. DeLiberto. While we were there, he was going to receive the Halderman Award being presented by the museum and Ford, for excellence in promoting and forwarding the Mustang Hobby and Mustang Clubs.

The club had to submit an application for Mike and I am going to include the letter here:

"When I got my first Mustang at age 16, it was Mike who encouraged me to join the Mustang club. I have now known him for over 35 years, and

that entire time he has spent his life serving the Garden State Region Mustang Club. Mike is a passionate Mustang and Ford enthusiast and loves all things Ford. Here are just a few of Mike's accomplishments in the Mustang Club world:

-Mike was the FOUNDER of the Garden State Region Mustang Club in 1993. The club originally used to meet in his house.

-He was president of the club for 14 of the last 28 years and is running again now.

-Mike has served on the BOARD of

GSRMC for 27 of the clubs 28 years

-He has been the editor of the newsletter "Pony XPress" for all but 4 of the 28 years

-He has been chair or Co-Chair of our 2 annual car shows for over 20 years (These shows raise large sums of money for our charities)

GALE ALDERMA

-Mike handles ordering all our club merchandise and dash plaques for our shows.

-He has also organized and run several road rallies/cruises through the club's history.

-Years ago, when his family came upon hard times, and he had to sell his own mustang, he still ran the club for us. He did not own one anymore and could have left. But he stayed to help the GSRMC.

-Every year he arranges a club photo with all members and their cars. Organizing that many cars is no easy feat.

and the title was in my name! I picked her up on my 23rd birthday and drove her home.

Since then, she's been nothing but reliable and a blast to drive. It's my daily driver, which was purposely why I looked for an EcoBoost Premium. I average about




22-24mpg combined, which is awesome in my eyes; on my long road trips I average anywhere from 30-36mpg. I also looked specifically for either a 2016 or 2017 model, because 2015 had the outdated Sync2 system and I am not a fan of the facelift and new rims that began in 2018. The odometer currently sits at around 43k miles, and I've taken her as far north as Kennebunkport, ME all the way down to Virginia Beach and the surrounding area. It's a phenomenal road trip car! I also have not modified it in any way: it's all stock. I do have a 6yr/72k mile full coverage warranty through Ford, which was a hell of a bargain and provides a lot of peace of mind. I also sprung for the additional tire & rim + dent & ding coverages.

Another thing I've noticed: Ingot Silver seems to be a very hard-to-find color. In almost a year and half of ownership, I've only ever seen 3 others: all GTs, only one of which was a coupe. Some may see it as a boring color option befitting of its rental spec origins, but it's so striking at certain angles; I feel it also makes it less of a cop magnet. Cosmetically, the only things I've added are silver trim around the driver and passenger air vents, silver trim around the infotainment system, and my two rear window decals: one supporting the Navy (my grandpa was a WWII destroyer escort vet) and one supporting the NJ State Police.

Otherwise, I also take great pride in my license plates: "1 PUG." To me, they're what make my car MY car. "Pug" was my nickname growing up, and "PUG" plates are one of the main things I look for for my collection. In NJ, my 1 PUG plates are called courtesy plates, because you have to request them from your local senator; "P" is a county code (Passaic, in my case), "UG" is usually the person's initials but can be any two letters, and "1" is any number between 1 and 20. They are usually only assigned to people with political connections, much like how my grandfather got his back in the early 60s when he was a councilman in town. As a plate collector with over 2,000 plates, those "1 PUG"s are the perfect accessory to my Mustang, and I plan on getting that number on every graphic base NJ has to offer. Right now they are on the Liberty State Park base.
