RETIREMENT RIDE

After retiring in 2017, GSRMC member Tom Kennedy was looking for a Mustang. He had a specific car in mind; stock 2011-12 GT500, with less than 30k miles. Color preferences were (1) Kona Blue w/red stripes, (2) Silver/gray w/black stripes, or (3) Black w/stripes (but not red). As is common these days, Tom used Google and Facebook Shelby Forums, multiple times daily, to search for a car within a 250-mile radius.

In July 2017 he found a black 2011 with 29k miles, located in Trenton. After a couple of messages and a phone call, he and his wife arranged to meet the owner. Although, from the pictures, they thought the car had white stripes, when they pulled into the empty parking lot of a closed strip mall, they noticed that the stripes were in fact silver. After a quick walk-around, Tom's wife said the magic words; "Take it for a ride. If you like it, buy it."

This particular 2011 Shelby GT500 is 1 of 1,470 out of the total coupe production of 4,150 that



was painted Black. It is, however, one of just 95 with Satin Silver stripes. All GT500s for 2011 had an all-new aluminum block, supercharged 5.4-liter V8 that was backed by a 6-speed manual transmission. At 550 hp, it was only rated at 10 hp more than in 2010, but the engine was 102 lbs. lighter.



This Shelby was in excellent, mostly original condition and has the optional Electronics Package (8-inch nav screen, dual zone climate controls, SYNC voice activated system), Shaker 500 audio system and charcoal black seats with silver stripes. The

previous owner updated the rear taillights to the 2013/14 model year style and had the aluminum wheels powder coated black.

For Tom, this Shelby GT500 is the culmination of a 50-year dream. It started right after high school when a friend's dad bought a 1968 Shelby GT350. He thought it was so cool riding around with his friend in that car. Soon after my friend's dad bought his GT350, his parents bought him a one year old 1967 Mustang coupe, with a 289 V8 2bbl and auto trans. Yes, his parents were very generous, but their reason was to keep him from buying a motorcycle.

Some 23 years later Tom bought a new Emerald Green 1991 GT 5-speed. He added a Stormin' Norman high rise hood, a California wing on the back, and some minor mods like 3:55 gears, Strange axles, sub-frames, Flowmasters, Centerforce clutch, and slicks/skinnies for the track. In 2000 came a 5-speed 1993 LX that was built by Outrageous Mustangs in Jackson, NJ. Although heavily modified, including 4:10 gears, this was both a 12 second weekend race car and a daily driver to work. He sold this car in 2011 for a Toyota Camry and promptly lost half his friends.

Although Tom used to drag race at Englishtown and Great Meadows with those prior Mustangs, this Shelby will not see any track time. However, when he started looking for a Shelby, his



wife had one condition: you have to drive it. So, he drives the GT500 every day, as long as the roads are not wet or covered with salt in the winter. Most rides are less than an hour and include local roads and highways to run through all six gears.


