# SMART UPGRADES & ECOBOOST POWER MAKE THIS '65 MUSTANG ACCESSIBLE TO A WIDE RANGE OF DRIVERS

ad the original Mustang not been dubbed a "pony car," it could have just as easily been pegged as a sport compact. It was just a regular Ford economy car, the Falcon, slightly reconfigured for better proportions and handling. Still, it didn't weigh much (well under 3,000 pounds, even for a convertible like this) and the 120-horsepower, 200-cu.in. six-cylinder moved a base-model convertible in a suitably sporty manner for the era. Eras change, however, and today the average driver is used to not only more responsiveness in a vehicle, but better braking, lower engine speed on the highway, and a whole host of other conveniences—even while the car drinks far less fuel than the 20-or-so miles per gallon boasted by the original "Thrift Power Six" engine, created for the 1960 Falcon.

By 1965, the original four-main, 90-hp, 144-cu.in. Falcon six had matured into a seven-main engine of considerable durability and adequate economy. Sticking with a manual transmission, as this car was originally equipped, did a lot to improve the driving experience. A floor-shift three-speed was standard equipment in a Mustang, with a Dagenham four-speed borrowed from Ford of England as an option for drivers of a sportier bent.

In regard to engine sizes, the 2.3-liter designation has been around a long time now for Ford. It could have described the original 144-cu.in. Falcon six, but it has

mostly referred to four-cylinders. At present, Dearborn's 2.3-liter is a direct injection, turbocharged four-cylinder that is part of a Ford Motor Company program to replace cylinders and displacement with extremely precise air and fuel management. When paired with a six-speed manual, it is the modern Mustang's equivalent of this car's base powertrain setup.



This engine appealed to Paul Cuff, our feature car's owner. Paul, of Angel's Camp, California, is the owner of America Road Trips, which offers collectible car rentals and road trip planning services, like itineraries for cruising Route 66. Or, for instance, if you've ever dreamed about driving an old convertible along California's Pacific Coast Highway, Paul can help you out including renting you the smartly restomodded 2.3-liter EcoBoost-powered Mustang featured here.

"The concept for America Road Trips rentals spawned out of a Route 66 road trip in April of 2019," Paul says. "That trip consisted of late model Mustangs, Shelbys, and an Alfa Romeo Stelvio Quadrifoglio. In mid-2019, the process of searching for the "prototype" vehicle began in earnest. I wanted to take a vintage first-generation Mustang and incorporate virtually all the features that made our 2019 Route 66 road trip seamless and problem-free."

That trip through the Desert Southwest in springtime had actually started out with plans to drive vintage cars, "but the desire for air conditioning and a late model drivetrain won out," Paul relates. So, what if there

was some way to merge the two? To that end, he sought out the assistance of the Grotto brothers, Mike and Dave, retired law-enforcement officers and builders of an awardwinning Pro Street 1966 Mustang fastback known as *Toxic* 66.

Paul wanted people to have a worry-free experience driving his '65, which he purchased as a non-running but

cosmetically restored car in Colorado.

"After many late-night hours perusing online listings, a viable candidate was discovered in Colorado Springs," Paul says. "We immediately hit it off with the seller, Rod Brown. He was very enthused about being part of the process."

The Mustang had previously belonged to Rod's father and, while some sellers would've balked at having their dad's old Mustang so heavily reconfigured, Rod was thrilled, and he believed his father would've approved also.

"My dad was a tinkerer extraordinaire," Rod says.
"From electronics, to mechanics, to aeronautics, he loved taking things apart and putting them back together, fixing

broken things, improving on original designs, and even building from scratch rather than buying new. You should have seen the compressor in our garage when I was a kid: a refrigerator motor, an old LP tank, and sundry other parts, pulleys, and belts working together to make compressed air." He bought

convertible off a used-car lot near Denver, circa 1975. "This Mustang was to be his weekend project car," Rod says.

Dad's project car eventually became Rod's project car, and he pulled it down to "the studs" and gave it a complete restoration, stopping just short of the powertrain. Around 1999, Rod just sort of stopped driving it, leaving it sit for 21 years until Paul came along. By that point, the beautiful—but non-running—'Stang was the perfect basis for a conversion to 21st-century standards without any costly cosmetic work to deal with.

Plucking out the Mustang's 200-cu.in. inline-six, the Grottos pushed forward with Paul's plan to incorporate "improved performance, reliability, fuel economy, emissions, and added safety features." To that end, the '65 was modified to include four-wheel disc

brakes with a dual-reservoir master cylinder, three-point seat belts and headrests, digital climate control, electric power steering, steel-belted radials, halogen headlamps, LED taillamps, and an upgraded sound system.

A 2021 Ford Ranger 4x2 with this same 310-hp (plus 350 lb-ft of torque) engine knocks down a combined 23 mpg. The curb weight on this ragtop, as delivered, was 2,740 pounds. The Ranger doesn't come any lighter than 4,145 pounds. That's why this Mustang can get by with an AOD-E, a four-speed automatic from the mid-1990s (rebuilt by Performance Automatic of Frederick, Maryland) instead of the Ranger's 10-speed self-shifter. Modern drivers don't appreciate the three-pedal dance, and one of the reasons behind this project was as a pilot car for a rental fleet of similarly reconfigured oldies.

With more power on tap now than an original K-

code V-8, the sixcylinder suspension on the Mustang needed some upgrades. Five-lug front spindles from a V-8 car were sourced, along with a stouter 8-inch rear axle. Although many hack out the original shock towers and incorporate newer front suspension, the 2.3 swap actually played fairly nice with the stock engine bay, requiring

only what Paul refers to as "some creative welding by Mike Grotto." Then, the entire chassis was freshened up with new coils up front and new leaf springs out back, control arms, a front anti-sway bar, roller spring perches, new bushings, and KYB shocks.

The process began in March of 2020 and took approximately 15 months to complete. Paul says the rebuilt 'Stang merges new car driving manners with old-school cosmetics. Another build, with a six-cylinder Emberglo '66 convertible as a starting point, is already in the works. # BOB TASCA MAKES HISTORY IN FORD MUSTANG DARK HORSE FUNNY CAR

Bob Tasca III has enjoyed quite a bit of success in his various Ford Mustang funny cars over the years, claiming an overall victory at the NHRA Brainerd Nationals in Minnesota in 2022 – along with several others – as well as his second NHRA Camping World Drag Racing Series Funny Car Wally at Heartland Motorsports Park in Topeka, Kansas last year. However, the debut of the all-new 2024 Ford Mustang meant that some changes were on the horizon, and fittingly, the brand new Ford Mustang Dark Horse funny car was just revealed last month. Regardless, it didn't take long for Bob Tasca III to pilot that same machine to history.

In fact, Tasca III and his new Ford Mustang Dark Horse funny car recorded the fastest pass in drag racing history for a wheel-driven dragster with a scorching 341.68 mile-per-hour run during Q4 of the non-NHRA sanctioned PRO Superstar Shootout in Florida recently. This happened after Tasca managed to hit 339.87 mph during Q1 of that same event, which equaled the fastest pass on that portion of the race.

This record run forever etches Tasca's name in drag racing history as the fastest man ever in a wheel-driven drag racing competition – at least until he or someone else manages to eventually best that mark. Unfortunately, he just missed out on a win after losing to reigning funny car champ Matt Hagan in the second round of eliminations, recording a 4.137-second pass versus Hagan's 3.912 ET.

Regardless, it was still a highly successful weekend for Bob Tasca III and his brand new Mustang dragster, which bodes well for the 2024 season – fresh off a strong 2023 that saw Tasca III record the fastest quartermile time at 1,000 feet in his Mustang – 3.836 seconds – en route to his best career season finish.

### 2024 MUSTANG DARK HORSE LEGO SPEED CHAMPIONS DEBUTS

In recent years, we've seen more than a few Blue Oval models immortalized in Lego brick form, a list that includes vehicles like the S550 Ford Mustang, the Ford Mustang Shelby GT500, the Ford Maverick – with a custom kit designed by fans – and the most recent Ford GT. Now, we have yet another cool Lego offering to choose from – the 2024 Ford Mustang Dark Horse, which has just debuted in Speed Champions guise.

The 2024 Ford Mustang Dark Horse Speed Champions Lego model looks about as close to the real thing as anything made from bricks can be, and features quite a few nifty details including that model's unique headlights, front grille, rear spoiler, tailpipes, Ford and pony car logos/branding, and even a detailed interior with a dashboard and shifter, among other notable items. Unlike the real Dark Horse, this toy version also has a removable roof and comes with a driver wearing a Dark Horse branded hoodie, to boot.

Designed for kids ages nine and up, the 2024 Ford Mustang Dark Horse Speed Champions model is every bit as enjoyable for us older folks, and certainly seems like a fun way to pass some time – or build bonds with our kids, to boot. It can be created with the Lego Builder app for a guided and intuitive assembly process, then played with in a number of ways – or simply placed on display, alternatively.

The 2024 Ford Mustang Dark Horse Speed Champions Lego model consists of 344 pieces, and when assembled, measures in at 1.5 inches high, six inches long, and 2.5 inches wide. It retails for a reasonable \$26.99 and is available to purchase now.
